It's "39 Steps" in East Sonora Saturday, June 23



In 1986 my mom was a chaperone for a group of high-schoolers who were visiting the former Soviet Union. She had been doing this for several years and the kids who went knew by this time that Levis were a hot item over there. They'd pack their suit cases with them and sell them to the hotel and restaurant employees. The KGB was on to this but let it slide (for a free pair no doubt). From Moscow to Saint Petersburg to Kiev they went and then **KA-BOOM**, Chernobyl exploded. We saw it all on the news here, but had no word from the group. I put a rush on the T-shirt order. On my way to JFK the next day, I stopped at the shop to pick up my order. A shirt was proudly unfurled on the counter, and to my astonishment the "R" was left out of Chernobyl. What to do? A voice from the back room said, "Take a dollar off each shirt." **SOLD!**



And so I was off to the International Arrivals Building at JFK. It was crowded. Lots of friends and relatives waiting for their loved ones. Lots of press too. The new CNN also. I stood there with my big box of shirts. I had one of the T-shirts on under a flannel shirt. I removed the flannel, and a voice called out, "Hey, look at this guy!" Lights, cameras, action all in my face. Interviews, speeches, it was as if I had dynamite strapped around me. Shortly thereafter the plane landed, the passengers entered the room. Hugs, kisses, and tears for all involved. The T-shirts sold like cold Borscht on a hot day. The kids who bought shirts were thrilled. Everyone seemed to be in good spirits and health (nobody was glowing), but the clocks at my mom's house started to run fast for some reason. And nobody ever noticed the missing "R". That's my stoy and I'm sticking to it. Tony.

Bay Area Mansions; Hi Tech Restaurants and A Thanks for Daimler's Foresight

On May 19th the Sacramento Section had a drive to Filoli Mansion, a site known for its gardens, and as a set for movie and TV series production. Although for most of us this was our second drive there in as many years and despite that I learned a few new things about it.

After the 1906 earthquake, a lot of wealthy San Franciscans decided to move a bit further south down the Peninsula – only 30 miles or so. One of these families was the Bourne family who started their fortune in the California Gold Rush

In 1937, the Roths sold the estate with its 600+ acres to the founder of the Matson shipping lines, Wm Roth.

While the mansion is impressive – you would know it from watching the TV series *Dynasty* or *Heaven Can Wait*.

However its crown jewel is really its multi-themed gardens, easily a dozen.

After our visit, we had lunch at Buck's restaurant, where "Larry and Sergey" had lunch and, decided to form their own company with the strange name of Google. I had an interesting conversation with our server, who said that some high-tech titans regularly come in here. And to Daimler's foresight? 
